Health Promotion Breast cancer awareness month

Breast cancer is the most common cancer worldwide.

In 2020, 11.7% of all cancers diagnosed were female breast cancer.

In 2019, there were 25,100 men diagnosed with breast cancer and 12,100 deaths globally.

Breast Cancer UK estimates that around 30% of breast cancer cases in the UK can be prevented by making lifestyle changes. Simple changes include limiting alcohol, maintain a healthy weight, being active to reduce your risk. <u>Reduce Your Risk | Breast Cancer UK</u>

As of 1st October 2023, waiting time standards have been simplified for patients awaiting a cancer referral or treatment by the introduction of 3 new measures. NHS England have said the focus will be on "outcomes not process".

1. Faster Diagnosis Standard – Patients to be diagnosed, or 'rule out' cancer within 28 days of GP referral.

2. 31-day Treatment Standard – All cancer patients to begin treatment within 31 days once decision is made.

3. 62-day Treatment Standard – All patients to be receiving treatment within 62 days of initial referral or consultant upgrade.
