Help and support for families of babies and children up to 19 years old, or 25 years old with additional needs. Open Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm.

Family Hub Derby can support with: Mental or Physical Health issues, Housing and Debt problems, Domestic Abuse, Parenting Classes, finding a Health Visitor or Midwife, help feeding your baby, Perinatal Mental Health support and some Youth services.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021, creates a statutory definition of domestic abuse, which is:

Any incident or pattern of incidents of controlling, coercive or threatening behaviour, violence, or abuse between those aged 16 or over who are or have been intimate partners or family members regardless of gender or sexuality.

Domestic abuse can happen to anyone regardless of age, race, income, religion, belief, sex, disability, culture, or sexual orientation.

Most people will recognise physical abuse as being a type of domestic abuse but there are many other ways for abusers to assert power over their victims, including:

- psychological (safelives link)
- emotional (relate link)
- sexual (counselling directory link)
- <u>financial (womens aid link)</u> or <u>economic (surviving economic abuse link)</u>
- online and digital (online support link)

Children, young people, and families who are affected by domestic abuse or violence can get support, including refuge accommodation, by contacting Derbyshire Domestic Abuse Helpline.
